



## **Community Nursing Service Level Alliance Team**

### **Meeting summary 24<sup>th</sup> March 2015**

The SLAT received a presentation from Pat Cook, General Manager of Te Manu Toroa. Pat provided an overview of the services provided through Nga Mataapuna Oranga and Te Manu Toroa, and the values and principles of Whanau Ora and the Whanaungatanga model of care. The SLAT endorsed that the values and principles of Whanau Ora align with and support the aims and objectives of the project.

A report was discussed from the members' site visit to Waikato District Health Board and Midland Health Network in Hamilton on the 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2015. Site visits have been arranged to Hawkes Bay and the Eastern Bay of Plenty Primary Health Alliance (EBPHA) in Whakatane for mid-April. EBPHA has implemented an Integrated Case Management service and the SLAT members would like to understand more about this service to inform the planning process. These two visits are the last planned site visits in the SLAT's work plan.

More feedback is being gathered from stakeholders through group-specific workshops to inform the planning process. Brochures to collect patient feedback are being printed and distributed in the coming week. A Community Nursing page has been established on the Bay of Plenty District Health Board website. The site contains: information about the project; an electronic survey for people to provide input to the planning work; the SLAT meeting summaries; and a summary of the feedback from the open forums. The SLAT continued its planning work. A strong theme emerging from stakeholder feedback to date is for one point of contact for referrals and co-ordination of care. For the remainder of the meeting the SLAT focussed its discussions on teasing out the elements of this.
